

Purpose of Webinar – draw attention to the following;	COVID-19 impacts on GESI -perspectives on energy
Myriad of gender and inclusion disparities in energy access – see GESI Handbook link	Health sector: delays in supplies negatively impact productivity
 Existence of success stories of 'what's works for GESI in OGS other speakers in this webinar 	Reduced family incomes with the economic meltdown stretching energy affordability
Coffey - prioritized GESI in ACE-TAF in all programmatic interventions now taking off in all 14 target countries	 Increased demand for energy: families at home. Appreciating governments' policy not to disconnect utility bills defaulters
 Knowledge management is core to scaling up strategies that work for GESI. 	Reduced access to financing & business credit – now more compounded for the vulnerable
Series of three webinars (Western, Southern, Eastern Africa) providing a platform for region-specific sharing	Increased GBV and sexual offences with the 'stay home' restrictions – requiring greater access to uninterrupted energy







Private Sector	GESI in the OGS supply chains (manufacturing, distribution, sales, recruitment/pay) Innovative financing for vulnerable GESI concerns included in the agenda of solar associations Pushing for access to OGS products in remote regions
Investors & Donors	Low-cost loans and conditional grants to support access to OGS in remote regions, GESI-TA to companies Incentives to companies posting positive GESI indicators Lexplore partnership with governments on social protection for extremely vulnerable
Non Profits (NGO's, CBO's)	Greater efficiencies in energy access via social protection advocacy on GESI-responsive policies capacity development for vulnerable groups in solar entrepreneurship
